DESCRIPTION:

Fruit tree. It is from 2 to 7 m tall. It grow up in all regions in Italy.

Leaves: deciduous, simple, alternate, obovated, sharp on the apex, with doublethooted margin and with evident ribs. They are provided by hairs on the lower page. They are emerald green on the top page while they're lighter and opaque on the lower. the petiole is short and hairy.

Bark: it's brown/grey, early without hairs with longitudinal grooves and spread lenticels.

Flowers: they are unisexual. Males are gather in yellow pendulous catkins that grow up in autumn and are rich of pollen with anemophilous diffusion (wind). The females are shaped gem from which escape evident red stigmas.

Fruits: hazelnut, dried fruits with wooden shell, covered by an herbaceous dome.
